### OUR SHOP ANNIVERSARY

We have just celebrated our first anniversary in our new shop on Mardol and would like to say a big thank you for all the wonderful donations we have received. Donations can be dropped off at the shop or at the shelter on Lyth Hill.

One way for us to get even more from your generous donations is using the Gift Aid scheme.

If you earn enough money to pay tax in the UK you can sign up to the scheme. When we sell a Gift Aid donation we can reclaim some of the tax that the donor has paid, this amount is 25% of each donation. If we sell a coat for £10.00 that is an extra £2.50 provided by the

Government, this is a significant boost for funding the shelter at no cost to the donor.

All the money made from our shop, Facebook market place and fund raising events goes directly to care for all the cats and kittens. With the cost of living crisis it is vital that we can raise as much money as possible to cover the cost of food, utility bills and mostly vets bills.

### WINTER HAZARDS FOR CATS

by Susie Phillips







Winter brings hazards into our homes and garages for our cats and even local cats in some cases. It is important to be aware of them so that you can help protect your cats.

Anti Freeze is highly toxic to cats who will need immediate veterinary assistance if they ingest it or get it on their fur. So please use extra caution when storing or using anti-freeze and ensure that any spillages are cleaned up quickly.

**Seasonal Plant Risks** – Poinsettias, Mistletoe, Holly, Ivy, Christmas Cherry, Christmas Trees and Cyclamens.

### **Christmas Trees and Decorations**

 Pose an injury due to climbing, eating decorations and chewing wires.

**Candles and Essential Oils** – risk of burns and ingestion of oils.

**Food Risks** – Chocolate, Grapes, Raisins, Turkey and other poultry bones and other human foods. Check out our Winter Hazards Blog for more information about each hazard.

### Merlin



This young boy came to us following the death of his owner. He arrived with a bit of a concerning vet history! His history showed that the vets who performed his neutering were concerned about his breathing, they could feel a dent in his chest and suspected he had an ingrowing sternum.

Upon arrival at the shelter, he was whisked away for x-rays and

investigation to determine what is going on. Our vets found that he has a condition called Pectus Excavatum, which is likely congenital and can compress the heart. Luckily

for Merlin, there was no need for invasive, corrective surgery and he has found a wonderful home with an understanding owner. His new family know they need to watch his weight to ensure there's no added pressure on his heart, and they are making sure he gets all the love he needs

# VET DETECTIVE: THE CASE OF GEORGIF AND HIS HOLEY LEG

Little Georgie came to Shropshire Cat Rescue with a history of having needed antibiotic treatment for an infected leg. When we first met him, his sweet character won us over and on initial examination, no abnormalities were found. After vaccinating him and stealing a moment for an obligatory cuddle (the highlight of our Thursday vet visits) we popped him back in his basket

A few weeks later he was brought to the surgery to be castrated; a short operation done under general anaesthetic. When shaving his leg to administer the anaesthetic injection, a new swelling was noticed; curious to know what it was, we took an x-ray.

To our surprise, we found that he had a hole in his leg! Above this there was a small fragment of loose bone that had become infected; this is called a Sequestrum. The



piece of bone was acting like a foreign body, and infection had built up around it, hence the swelling that we could feel. We presume that he had been bitten by another cat, and because he was young, with soft, growing bones, a fragment of bone had been pushed out. The initial course of antibiotics before we met him had

settled the infection, but because the sequestrum was still there, the problem had recurred.

We performed a small operation to remove the fragment of bone, which was 3mm long and very sharp. Infection was flushed out and sutures placed. At his check up a week later his leg was fully healed. A very satisfying case.



Back in 2019, a call for help came in to take in a young boy and his mother after she started to become territorial over the kittens she once doted on. Following worries they would struggle in our homing pens after a life outside with free reign of the land, volunteer Karen Ashton headed out to visit the pair and very quickly fell in love with them.

By December, the pair came to the shelter, and it was soon clear we weren't going to find them the perfect home together. With Vera being nearly 10 and Morris only 2, the age gap seemed to scare the potential adopters away. So, the decision was made to release them into our Residents area, as the shelter grounds were a similar location to what they were used to – and boy, did they settle!



The pair have thrived considerably since becoming residents, making friends with the other cats on the grounds and still maintaining their bond with each other despite the numerous visitors and cats they meet daily. Vera has enthralled visitors with her funky little meow and piercing eyes, she comes alive at dusk and is often found playing and climbing trees when the sun goes down.


